Background


- Residents 70 years and older use approximately 70% of the total bed days at Burnaby Hospital (BUH)
- The fastest growing age group in BUH is the 90 + category


Data measures


- ER admit rate for those 75 and older
 data was collected for the same time period in 2004 to account for seasonal variances
- LOS for patients 75 and older as above


The Pilot Phase

- The pilot ran from May August, 2005
- The GEN worked M-F, 8-4 pm
- Assessment tools were adapted from VGH and PAH
- GPs and hospital/community staff were made aware of the pilot through a letter campaign
- Faxed copies of assessments sent to GPs, LTC facilities and homecare to ensure continuity of care.











- A savings of 3.94 patient days on average/patient
- This equates to 1170 bed days over 4 months (for those seen) or 9.6 beds
